Tu Que Bivas: Photography Pop-Up by Becky Behar 5–9 pm

Inspired by part of a Sephardic blessing in Ladino that translates to, "May you live, grow, and thrive like a little fish in fresh water," *Tu Que Bivas* is a personal journey through photo-based artist Becky Behar's roots. Behar is a Sephardic Jew, part of the diasporic population expelled from Spain and Portugal during the Inquisition in the late 15th century. Her family has migrated to Turkey, then Colombia, and finally to the United States. Throughout, it has maintained Sephardic customs, the Ladino language, and Jewish religion.

This series of photographs explores how Behar's mother and daughter continue to enact their family's age-old traditions and rituals today. As she contemplates the different ways of preserving and celebrating history, Behar considers her own relationship to her heritage and the interpretations of it that her daughter carries forward.
